

TRAVELING WITH FIREARMS

You are allowed to pack firearms and ammunition in your **checked luggage**. Be sure to follow all state and federal laws and airline regulations.

CHECK ALL FIREARMS

All firearms and ammunition must be packed in checked baggage. Do not bring firearms through the security checkpoint.

INFORM THE AIRLINE

You must declare your firearm to your airline when you check in. Complete the provided declaration card and place it in your case.

USE SEPARATE BAGS

Check your bags before traveling; a forgotten firearm can result in stiff penalties. Consider having separate bags for the range and for travel.

PACK SECURELY

Firearms must be packed in a hard-sided case with padding. Use all available locks. Multiple firearms may be packed in the same case.

UNLOAD ALL AMMO

Remove any magazines or rounds from the chamber. Ammo may be packed in the same hard-sided case as your firearm.

KNOW THE LAW

It is your responsibility to follow all rules and regulations both at the airport and your destination.



CHECK IN

Bring your firearm directly to the airline check in counter when you arrive at GSP. Do not bring any firearms to the security checkpoint or place in carry on luggage.



STAY CLOSE

At GSP, luggage is checked quickly. Remain in the ticket lobby for 5-10 minutes following check in. This way you can address any issues with your firearm before going through security.



CONTACT DETAILS

Attach a business card or write your name and phone number on the exterior of your hard-sided case. This will make it easier to contact you if there are any issues.
